In making this gift, Narrator and Interviewer understand that they are assigning all right, title, and interest in copyright to the Work to the Museum. By virtue of this agreement, the Museum will have the right to use the Work for any research, educational, promotional or other purpose, including electronic reproduction, that the Museum may deem appropriate and without any further approval. Narrator and Interviewer also grant the Museum the right to use their names, voices, statements, and likenesses in conjunction with any Internet display, media production, promotional material, exhibitions, or any other medium, known or unknown, in perpetuity unless as restricted by the Optional Restrictions contained at the bottom of this document.

In return, the Museum grants Narrator a non-exclusive license to utilize the interview(s) during his or her lifetime. The Narrator and Interviewer acknowledge and agree that neither will receive any other form of payment from the Museum.

The Narrator and the Interviewer hereby release the Museum and its assignees and designees from any and all claims arising out of or in conjunction with the use of the interview, including but not limited to claims for copyright infringement, defamation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or any other right. The Narrator and the Interviewer, if not a Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs employee, understand that should any of the material contained within the Work expose either to legal actions the Museum shall not be responsible for defending either and shall in no way be held liable for any results from the legal actions.

Should any part of the Work be found to include materials that the Museum deems inappropriate for retention with the collection or for transfer to other collections in the Museum, the Museum may dispose of such materials in accordance with its procedures for disposition of materials.

The Narrator and Interviewer recognize that this document, along with the material originating from the

interview, is a public document and is subject to the Wisconsin Open Records Law.

The Narrator and Interviewer agree that this Agreement is the entire Agreement, supersedes all prior discussions, and the agreement may not be modified, altered, amended, or otherwise changed except by mutual written agreement by the Narrator and Interviewer and the Museum.

The Narrator attests that Narrator has voluntarily agreed to be interviewed and the Interviewer attests that the Interviewer has voluntarily agreed to conduct the interview and the Narrator and the Interviewer agree this document contains the entire and complete agreement concerning the use and preservation of the Work.
